

## <u>Exercise -Present Perfect Continuous Tense</u> (<u>Key</u>)

1) We have been waiting for the train since morning.

Neg: We have not been waiting for the train since morning.

Que: Have we been waiting for the train since morning?

2) They have been renovating their house for weeks.

Neg: They have not been renovating their house for weeks.

Que: Have they been renovating their house for weeks?

3) It has been snowing continuously since yesterday.

Neg: It has not been snowing continuously since yesterday.

Que: Has it been snowing continuously since yesterday?

4) John has been learning to play the guitar for months.

Neg: John has not been learning to play the guitar for months.

Que: Has John been learning to play the guitar for months?

5) Sarah has been attending dance classes regularly.

Neg: Sarah has not been attending dance classes regularly.

Que: Has Sarah been attending dance classes regularly?
