Neg. Sarah had not been cooking dinner for the family for hours.  
Que. Had Sarah been cooking dinner for the family for hours?

- 62)** Pos. The workers had been building the house for months before it was completed.  
Neg. The workers had not been building the house for months before it was completed.  
Que. Had the workers been building the house for months before it was completed?

- 63)** Pos. I will have been working on this project for three hours by the time you arrive.  
Neg. I will not have been working on this project for three hours by the time you arrive.  
Que. Will I have been working on this project for three hours by the time you arrive?

- 64)** Pos. You will have been studying French for six months when you take the proficiency test.  
Neg. You will not have been studying French for six months when you take the proficiency test.  
Que. Will you have been studying French for six months when you take the proficiency test?

- 65)** Pos. He will have been playing the guitar for two hours by the end of the concert.  
Neg. He will not have been playing the guitar for two hours by the end of the concert.  
Que. Will he have been playing the guitar for two hours by the end of the concert?
