



Present Perfect Continuous Tense **Write Interrogative Sentences (Key)**

1) I have not been studying for three hours.

Pos: *Have I been studying for three hours?*

2) You have not been working hard all day.

Pos: *Have you been working hard all day?*

3) He has not been practicing the piano since morning.

Pos: *Has he been practicing the piano since morning?*

4) She has not been cooking dinner for us.

Pos: *Has she been cooking dinner for us?*

5) We have not been exercising at the gym.

Pos: *Have we been exercising at the gym?*

6) They have not been playing basketball since noon.

Pos: *Have they been playing basketball since noon?*

7) It has not been raining all day.

Pos: *Has it been raining all day?*

8) John has not been studying Spanish for a month.

Pos: *Has John been studying Spanish for a month?*

9) Sarah has not been working on her project.

Pos: *Has Sarah been working on her project?*

10) The children have not been playing in the park.

Pos: *Have the children been playing in the park?*
