Neg: They will not have been working on the project for weeks.

2) Will it have been raining for days?

Pos: It will have been raining for days.

Neg: It will not have been raining for days.

3) Will John have been studying French for a year before his trip to Paris?

Pos: John will have been studying French for a year before his trip to Paris.

Neg: John will not have been studying French for a year before his trip to Paris.

4) Will Sarah have been working as a teacher for five years by the end of this month?

Pos: Sarah will have been working as a teacher for five years by the end of this month.

Neg: Sarah will not have been working as a teacher for five years by the end of this month.

5) Will the athletes have been training intensively for the upcoming competition?

Pos: The athletes will have been training intensively for the upcoming competition.

Neg: The athletes will not have been training intensively for the upcoming competition.
