Neg. They have not been discussing the issue for hours.

Que. Have they been discussing the issue for hours?

17) Pos. It has been snowing heavily since morning.

Neg. It has not been snowing heavily since morning.

Que. Has it been snowing heavily since morning?

18) Pos. Mary has been playing the piano for years.

Neg. Mary has not been playing the piano for years.

Que. Has Mary been playing the piano for years?

19) Pos. Tom has been working on his car all weekend.

Neg. Tom has not been working on his car all weekend.

Que. Has Tom been working on his car all weekend?

20) Pos. The students have been studying for exams.

Neg. The students have not been studying for exams.

Que. Have the students been studying for exams?
