

## Exercise -Past Perfect Continuous Tense (Key)

1) They had been studying for the test all week.

Neg: They had not been studying for the test all week.

Que: Had they been studying for the test all week?

2) It had been raining since morning when we decided to go outside.

Neg: It had not been raining since morning when we decided to go outside.

Que: Had it been raining since morning when we decided to go outside?

3) John had been working out at the gym regularly before he got injured.

Neg: John had not been working out at the gym regularly before he got injured.

Que: Had John been working out at the gym regularly before he got injured?

Sarah had been practicing her presentation for days before the conference.

Neg: Sarah had not been practicing her presentation for days before the conference.

Que: Had Sarah been practicing her presentation for days before the conference?

The children had been playing in the park all afternoon before it started raining.

Neg: The children had not been playing in the park all afternoon before it started raining.

Que: Had the children been playing in the park all afternoon before it started raining?
