



Present Perfect Continuous Tense **Write Interrogative Sentences (Key)**

1) The children have not been playing outside all afternoon.

Pos: *Have the children been playing outside all afternoon?*

2) I have not been writing a novel for the past year.

Pos: *Have I been writing a novel for the past year?*

3) You have not been working late every night this week.

Pos: *Have you been working late every night this week?*

4) He has not been practicing his basketball skills for hours.

Pos: *Has he been practicing his basketball skills for hours?*

5) She has not been studying for her exams all day.

Pos: *Has she been studying for her exams all day?*

6) We have not been exploring new hiking trails lately.

Pos: *Have we been exploring new hiking trails lately?*

7) They have not been discussing the project for hours.

Pos: *Have they been discussing the project for hours?*

8) It has not been raining since this morning.

Pos: *Has it been raining since this morning?*

9) Mary has not been learning to play the piano for years.

Pos: *Has Mary been learning to play the piano for years?*

10) Tom has not been working on his car all day.

Pos: *Has Tom been working on his car all day?*
