



Present Perfect Continuous Tense **Write Interrogative Sentences (Key)**

1) Sarah has not been working on her project all week.

Pos: *Has Sarah been working on her project all week?*

2) The children have not been playing outside all day.

Pos: *Have the children been playing outside all day?*

3) I have not been reading this book for hours.

Pos: *Have I been reading this book for hours?*

4) He has not been studying for the test all day.

Pos: *Has he been studying for the test all day?*

5) She has not been working on her computer for hours.

Pos: *Has she been working on her computer for hours?*

6) We have not been traveling for weeks.

Pos: *Have we been traveling for weeks?*

7) They have not been discussing the project all day.

Pos: *Have they been discussing the project all day?*

8) It has not been snowing since morning.

Pos: *Has it been snowing since morning?*

9) We have not been waiting for the bus for a long time.

Pos: *Have we been waiting for the bus for a long time?*

10) I have not been working on this project for the past week.

Pos: *Have I been working on this project for the past week?*
