



Past Perfect Continuous Tense

Write Interrogative Sentences (Key)

1) John had not been studying for the exam for weeks before he finally passed.

Pos: *Had John been studying for the exam for weeks before he finally passed?*

2) Sarah had not been writing her novel for months before she finished it.

Pos: *Had Sarah been writing her novel for months before she finished it?*

3) The construction workers had not been building the house for several months before it was completed.

Pos: *Had the construction workers been building the house for several months before it was completed?*

4) I had not been studying for the exam for hours.

Pos: *Had I been studying for the exam for hours?*

5) You had not been working on the project all day.

Pos: *Had you been working on the project all day?*

6) She had not been practicing the piano for hours.

Pos: *Had she been practicing the piano for hours?*

7) We had not been traveling for days before reaching our destination.

Pos: *Had we been traveling for days before reaching our destination?*

8) They had not been studying for the exam all night.

Pos: *Had they been studying for the exam all night?*

9) John had not been working on the project for months before it was completed.

Pos: *Had John been working on the project for months before it was completed?*

10) Sarah had not been cooking dinner for the family for hours.

Pos: *Had Sarah been cooking dinner for the family for hours?*
