

## Perfect continuous Form of Tense Write Interrogative Sentences (Key)

1) You had not been studying for hours before the exam.

Que: Had you been studying for hours before the exam?

Sarah had not been practicing her presentation for days before the conference.

Que: Had Sarah been practicing her presentation for days before the conference?

3) Sarah had not been writing her novel for months before completing it.

Que: Had Sarah been writing her novel for months before completing it?

4) Sarah had not been working out at the gym for an hour.

Que: Had Sarah been working out at the gym for an hour?

5) I had not been working on this project for the past week.

Que: Had I been working on this project for the past week?

You will not have been studying French for six months when you take the proficiency test.

Que: Will you have been studying French for six months when you take the proficiency test?

7) John had not been studying French for months before his trip to Paris.

Que: Had John been studying French for months before his trip to Paris?

8) Sarah will not have been traveling around the world for months.

Que: Will Sarah have been traveling around the world for months?

9) We have not been working on this project for weeks.

Que: Have we been working on this project for weeks?

10) We had not been traveling for days before reaching our destination.

Que: Had we been traveling for days before reaching our destination?
