1) It will not have been raining for days by the time we arrive.

Que: Will it have been raining for days by the time we arrive?

2) We have not been waiting in line for the concert for hours.

Que: Have we been waiting in line for the concert for hours?

3) She has not been baking a cake for the party.

Que: Has she been baking a cake for the party?

4) We had not been traveling for hours before we arrived at our destination.

Que: Had we been traveling for hours before we arrived at our destination?

5) You have not been working hard all day.

Que: Have you been working hard all day?

6) He had not been playing the guitar since the morning.

Que: Had he been playing the guitar since the morning?

7) We will not have been waiting in line for hours before the store opens.

Que: Will we have been waiting in line for hours before the store opens?

8) You have not been working on the project all day.

Que: Have you been working on the project all day?

9) He had not been working in the garden since early morning.

Que: Had he been working in the garden since early morning?

10) We will not have been waiting in line for two hours.

Que: Will we have been waiting in line for two hours?
