



Perfect continuous Form of Tense **Write Negative Sentences (Key)**

1) Have they been practicing their lines for weeks?

Neg: They have not been practicing their lines for weeks.

2) Have we been waiting in line for the concert for hours?

Neg: We have not been waiting in line for the concert for hours.

3) Had it been raining heavily all day?

Neg: It had not been raining heavily all day.

4) Had the workers been building the house for months before it was completed?

Neg: The workers had not been building the house for months before it was completed.

5) Had John been studying English for months before he moved to an English-speaking country?

Neg: John had not been studying English for months before he moved to an English-speaking country.

6) Had John been working on his novel for months before he finally completed it?

Neg: John had not been working on his novel for months before he finally completed it.

7) Have I been reading a book for the past hour?

Neg: I have not been reading a book for the past hour.

8) Had we been living in the city for a decade before we moved to the countryside?

Neg: We had not been living in the city for a decade before we moved to the countryside.

9) Had you been studying English for a long time before the exam?

Neg: You had not been studying English for a long time before the exam.

10) Will she have been writing the book for several years?

Neg: She will not have been writing the book for several years.
