Write Interrogative Sentences (Key)

1) They have not been practicing their lines for weeks.

Que: Have they been practicing their lines for weeks?

2) We have not been waiting in line for the concert for hours.

Que: Have we been waiting in line for the concert for hours?

3) It had not been raining heavily all day.

Que: Had it been raining heavily all day?

4) The workers had not been building the house for months before it was completed.

Que: Had the workers been building the house for months before it was completed?

5) John had not been studying English for months before he moved to an English-speaking country.

Que: Had John been studying English for months before he moved to an English-speaking country?

6) John had not been working on his novel for months before he finally completed it.

Que: Had John been working on his novel for months before he finally completed it?

7) I have not been reading a book for the past hour.

Que: Have I been reading a book for the past hour?

8) We had not been living in the city for a decade before we moved to the countryside.

Que: Had we been living in the city for a decade before we moved to the countryside?

9) You had not been studying English for a long time before the exam.

Que: Had you been studying English for a long time before the exam?

10) She will not have been writing the book for several years.

Que: Will she have been writing the book for several years?
