



Perfect continuous Form of Tense **Write Interrogative Sentences (Key)**

1) It has not been snowing heavily since morning.

Que: *Has it been snowing heavily since morning?*

2) Mary has not been playing tennis for years.

Que: *Has Mary been playing tennis for years?*

3) The students have not been studying for the test all day.

Que: *Have the students been studying for the test all day?*

4) They had not been waiting in line for the concert since early morning.

Que: *Had they been waiting in line for the concert since early morning?*

5) Sarah had not been working out at the gym for an hour.

Que: *Had Sarah been working out at the gym for an hour?*

6) John had not been studying for the exam all night.

Que: *Had John been studying for the exam all night?*

7) They have not been discussing the project all day.

Que: *Have they been discussing the project all day?*

8) She has not been working on her computer all day.

Que: *Has she been working on her computer all day?*

9) It has not been raining since this morning.

Que: *Has it been raining since this morning?*

10) We had not been traveling for days before reaching our destination.

Que: *Had we been traveling for days before reaching our destination?*
