

Exercise Key-Perfect Continous Form of Tense

1)	Had Sarah been cooking dinner for the family for hours?
Pos:	Sarah had been cooking dinner for the family for hours.
Neg:	Sarah had not been cooking dinner for the family for hours.
2)	Have I been working on this project all week?
Pos:	I have been working on this project all week.
Neg:	I have not been working on this project all week.
3)	Have the students been preparing for the presentation?
Pos:	The students have been preparing for the presentation.
Neg:	The students have not been preparing for the presentation.
4)	Had we been traveling for hours before reaching the destination?
Pos:	We had been traveling for hours before reaching the destination.
Neg:	We had not been traveling for hours before reaching the destination.
5)	Will John have been working as a teacher for five years?
Pos:	John will have been working as a teacher for five years.
Neg:	John will not have been working as a teacher for five years.

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
