



Perfect continuous Form of Tense **Write Interrogative Sentences (Key)**

1) They have not been playing basketball since noon.

Que: Have they been playing basketball since noon?

2) I had not been studying English for two hours.

Que: Had I been studying English for two hours?

3) He had not been playing video games since morning.

Que: Had he been playing video games since morning?

4) I will not have been working on this project for three hours by the time you arrive.

Que: Will I have been working on this project for three hours by the time you arrive?

5) Sarah had not been practicing the piano for years before her concert performance.

Que: Had Sarah been practicing the piano for years before her concert performance?

6) He had not been playing video games since morning.

Que: Had he been playing video games since morning?

7) She has not been gardening for hours.

Que: Has she been gardening for hours?

8) I had not been working on the project all day long.

Que: Had I been working on the project all day long?

9) He has not been playing video games all day.

Que: Has he been playing video games all day?

10) It has not been snowing continuously since yesterday.

Que: Has it been snowing continuously since yesterday?
