7) It will not have been raining for days.

Pos: Will it have been raining for days?

8) John will not have been studying French for a year before his trip to Paris.

Pos: Will John have been studying French for a year before his trip to Paris?

9) Sarah will not have been working as a teacher for five years by the end of this month.

Pos: Will Sarah have been working as a teacher for five years by the end of this month?

10) The athletes will not have been training intensively for the upcoming competition.

Pos: Will the athletes have been training intensively for the upcoming competition?
