Neg: The children had not been playing in the park all afternoon before it started raining.

2) Had Sarah been studying Spanish for years before her trip to Spain?

Neg: Sarah had not been studying Spanish for years before her trip to Spain.

3) Has she been working on her computer for hours?

Neg: She has not been working on her computer for hours.

4) Had John been working on his novel for months before he finally completed it?

Neg: John had not been working on his novel for months before he finally completed it.

5) Had she been cooking dinner for the party all evening?

Neg: She had not been cooking dinner for the party all evening.

6) Will you have been studying French for six months?

Neg: You will not have been studying French for six months.

7) Had we been living in the city for a decade before we moved to the countryside?

Neg: We had not been living in the city for a decade before we moved to the countryside.

8) Had John been working on the project for months before it was completed?

Neg: John had not been working on the project for months before it was completed.

9) Have I been studying English for two hours?

Neg: I have not been studying English for two hours.

10) Have the children been playing outside all afternoon?

Neg: The children have not been playing outside all afternoon.
