



Perfect continuous Form of Tense **Write Negative Sentences (Key)**

1) Has he been working on his novel since last year?

Neg: He has not been working on his novel since last year.

2) Had the workers been building the house for months before it was completed?

Neg: The workers had not been building the house for months before it was completed.

3) Had it been raining heavily all afternoon?

Neg: It had not been raining heavily all afternoon.

4) Had she been cooking dinner for the family all evening?

Neg: She had not been cooking dinner for the family all evening.

5) Had she been painting since morning?

Neg: She had not been painting since morning.

6) Have I been practicing yoga for the past month?

Neg: I have not been practicing yoga for the past month.

7) Will Sarah have been working as a teacher for five years by the end of this month?

Neg: Sarah will not have been working as a teacher for five years by the end of this month.

8) Have the children been playing outside for hours?

Neg: The children have not been playing outside for hours.

9) Had I been studying for the exam all night?

Neg: I had not been studying for the exam all night.

10) Will they have been rehearsing for the play for weeks when opening night arrives?

Neg: They will not have been rehearsing for the play for weeks when opening night arrives.
