1) He has not been working on his novel since last year.

Que: *Has he been working on his novel since last year?*

2) The workers had not been building the house for months before it was completed.

Que: *Had the workers been building the house for months before it was completed?*

3) It had not been raining heavily all afternoon.

Que: *Had it been raining heavily all afternoon?*

4) She had not been cooking dinner for the family all evening.

Que: *Had she been cooking dinner for the family all evening?*

5) She had not been painting since morning.

Que: *Had she been painting since morning?*

6) I have not been practicing yoga for the past month.

Que: *Have I been practicing yoga for the past month?*

7) Sarah will not have been working as a teacher for five years by the end of this month.

Que: *Will Sarah have been working as a teacher for five years by the end of this month?*

8) The children have not been playing outside for hours.

Que: *Have the children been playing outside for hours?*

9) I had not been studying for the exam all night.

Que: *Had I been studying for the exam all night?*

10) They will not have been rehearsing for the play for weeks when opening night arrives.

Que: *Will they have been rehearsing for the play for weeks when opening night arrives?*
