

Exercise Key-Perfect Continuous Form of Tense

1) Will you have been working on the project for several hours?

Pos: You will have been working on the project for several hours.

Neg: You will not have been working on the project for several hours.

2) Has it been raining since this morning?

Pos: It has been raining since this morning.

Neg: It has not been raining since this morning.

3) Will we have been waiting in line for two hours?

Pos: We will have been waiting in line for two hours.

Neg: We will not have been waiting in line for two hours.

4) Had he been playing video games all day?

Pos: He had been playing video games all day.

Neg: He had not been playing video games all day.

5) Will we have been waiting in line for hours before the store opens?

Pos: We will have been waiting in line for hours before the store opens.

Neg: We will not have been waiting in line for hours before the store opens.
