

Exercise Key-Perfect Continuous Form of Tense

1) Will you have been studying French for six months?

Pos: You will have been studying French for six months.

Neg: You will not have been studying French for six months.

2) Had we been living in the city for a decade before we moved to the countryside?

Pos: We had been living in the city for a decade before we moved to the countryside.

Neg: We had not been living in the city for a decade before we moved to the countryside.

3) Had John been working on the project for months before it was completed?

Pos: John had been working on the project for months before it was completed.

Neg: John had not been working on the project for months before it was completed.

4) Have I been studying English for two hours?

Pos: I have been studying English for two hours.

Neg: I have not been studying English for two hours.

5) Have the children been playing outside all afternoon?

Pos: The children have been playing outside all afternoon.

Neg: The children have not been playing outside all afternoon.
