

Perfect continuous Form of Tense Write Interrogative Sentences (Key)

1) Sarah had not been cooking dinner for the family for hours.

Que: Had Sarah been cooking dinner for the family for hours?

2) I had not been working on the project all day long.

Que: Had I been working on the project all day long?

John had not been studying for the exam for months before he finally passed.

Que: Had John been studying for the exam for months before he finally passed?

4) I will not have been studying English for six months.

Que: Will I have been studying English for six months?

5) We have not been waiting for our food for a long time.

Que: Have we been waiting for our food for a long time?

6) You had not been studying for the exam all night.

Que: Had you been studying for the exam all night?

7) They will not have been rehearsing for the play for weeks.

Que: Will they have been rehearsing for the play for weeks?

8) She has not been painting a picture all day.

Que: Has she been painting a picture all day?

9) It had not been raining heavily since yesterday evening.

Que: Had it been raining heavily since yesterday evening?

10) He has not been playing football since this morning.

Que: Has he been playing football since this morning?
