1)	Had you been studying Spanish for months before your trip to Spain?
Pos:	You had been studying Spanish for months before your trip to Spain.
Neg:	You had not been studying Spanish for months before your trip to Spain.
2)	Had Sarah been practicing the piano for years before her concert performance?
Pos:	Sarah had been practicing the piano for years before her concert performance.
Neg:	Sarah had not been practicing the piano for years before her concert performance.
3)	Has Sarah been working on her art project all day?
Pos:	Sarah has been working on her art project all day.
Neg:	Sarah has not been working on her art project all day.
4)	Has Mary been learning to play the piano for years?
Pos:	Mary has been learning to play the piano for years.
Neg:	Mary has not been learning to play the piano for years.
5)	Had the children been playing in the park all afternoon?
Pos:	The children had been playing in the park all afternoon.
Neg:	The children had not been playing in the park all afternoon.

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
