| Neg: | I had not been working on this project for several hours. |
| 3) | Has John been studying Spanish for a month? |
| Pos: | John has been studying Spanish for a month. |
| Neg: | John has not been studying Spanish for a month. |
| 4) | Will they have been playing soccer since morning? |
| Pos: | They will have been playing soccer since morning. |
| Neg: | They will not have been playing soccer since morning. |
| 5) | Have you been studying English for hours? |
| Pos: | You have been studying English for hours. |
