

Exercise Key-Perfect Continuous Form of Tense

1) Had Sarah been cooking dinner for the family for hours?

Pos: Sarah had been cooking dinner for the family for hours.

Neg: Sarah had not been cooking dinner for the family for hours.

2) Had they been working on the project for weeks?

Pos: They had been working on the project for weeks.

Neg: They had not been working on the project for weeks.

3) Have the students been studying for exams?

Pos: The students have been studying for exams.

Neg: The students have not been studying for exams.

4) Has he been practicing his speech?

Pos: He has been practicing his speech.

Neg: He has not been practicing his speech.

5) Had John been working on his novel for months before he finally completed it?

Pos: John had been working on his novel for months before he finally completed it.

Neg: John had not been working on his novel for months before he finally completed it.
