

Exercise Key-Perfect Continous Form of Tense

1) Had Sarah been cooking dinner for the family for hours?

Pos: Sarah had been cooking dinner for the family for hours.

Neg: Sarah had not been cooking dinner for the family for hours.

2) Had I been working on the project all day long?

Pos: I had been working on the project all day long.

Neq: I had not been working on the project all day long.

Had John been studying for the exam for months before he finally passed?

Pos: John had been studying for the exam for months before he finally passed.

Neg: John had not been studying for the exam for months before he finally passed.

4) Will I have been studying English for six months?

Pos: I will have been studying English for six months.

Neg: I will not have been studying English for six months.

5) Have we been waiting for our food for a long time?

Pos: We have been waiting for our food for a long time.

Neg: We have not been waiting for our food for a long time.

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
