7) He had been working on the project since morning.

Que: Had he been working on the project since morning?

8) She had been practicing the piano for hours.

Que: Had she been practicing the piano for hours?

9) We had been traveling for days before reaching our destination.

Que: Had we been traveling for days before reaching our destination?

10) They had been playing basketball for two hours before the game was canceled.

Que: Had they been playing basketball for two hours before the game was canceled?
