



Perfect continuous Form of Tense **Write Interrogative Sentences (Key)**

1) He has not been playing the piano for three hours.

Que: *Has he been playing the piano for three hours?*

2) The children have not been playing in the park.

Que: *Have the children been playing in the park?*

3) I had not been working on this project for several hours.

Que: *Had I been working on this project for several hours?*

4) They will not have been playing soccer since morning.

Que: *Will they have been playing soccer since morning?*

5) You have not been studying French all evening.

Que: *Have you been studying French all evening?*

6) John has not been studying for the exam since morning.

Que: *Has John been studying for the exam since morning?*

7) John will not have been working as a chef for ten years.

Que: *Will John have been working as a chef for ten years?*

8) She will not have been studying for the exam since morning.

Que: *Will she have been studying for the exam since morning?*

9) You have not been working on this project all day.

Que: *Have you been working on this project all day?*

10) He had not been studying for the exam all night.

Que: *Had he been studying for the exam all night?*
