**5)** He will not have been playing the guitar for two hours by the end of the concert.

**Pos:** *Will he have been playing the guitar for two hours by the end of the concert?*

**6)** She will not have been traveling around Europe for a year by the time she returns home.

**Pos:** *Will she have been traveling around Europe for a year by the time she returns home?*

**7)** We will not have been waiting in line for hours before the store opens.

**Pos:** *Will we have been waiting in line for hours before the store opens?*

---

**8)** They will not have been rehearsing for the play for weeks when opening night arrives.

**Pos:** *Will they have been rehearsing for the play for weeks when opening night arrives?*

**9)** It will not have been raining all day by the time the outdoor event starts.

**Pos:** *Will it have been raining all day by the time the outdoor event starts?*

**10)** John will not have been studying for the exam all night before the morning comes.

**Pos:** *Will John have been studying for the exam all night before the morning comes?*
