



Perfect continuous Form of Tense **Write Negative Sentences (Key)**

1) Had he been playing the piano for three hours?

Neg: He had not been playing the piano for three hours.

2) Had we been waiting for the train for half an hour?

Neg: We had not been waiting for the train for half an hour.

3) Have you been studying for the exam for hours?

Neg: You have not been studying for the exam for hours.

4) Had the workers been building the house for months before it was completed?

Neg: The workers had not been building the house for months before it was completed.

5) Had you been studying for hours before the exam?

Neg: You had not been studying for hours before the exam.

6) Will John have been studying for the exam all night?

Neg: John will not have been studying for the exam all night.

7) Had we been traveling for days before reaching our destination?

Neg: We had not been traveling for days before reaching our destination.

8) Will John have been working as a teacher for five years?

Neg: John will not have been working as a teacher for five years.

9) Had the children been playing outside for hours?

Neg: The children had not been playing outside for hours.

10) Had they been waiting in line for the concert since early morning?

Neg: They had not been waiting in line for the concert since early morning.
