

Perfect continuous Form of Tense Write Interrogative Sentences (Key)

1) He had not been playing the piano for three hours.

Que: Had he been playing the piano for three hours?

2) We had not been waiting for the train for half an hour.

Que: Had we been waiting for the train for half an hour?

3) You have not been studying for the exam for hours.

Que: Have you been studying for the exam for hours?

The workers had not been building the house for months before it was completed.

Que: Had the workers been building the house for months before it was completed?

5) You had not been studying for hours before the exam.

Que: Had you been studying for hours before the exam?

6) John will not have been studying for the exam all night.

Que: Will John have been studying for the exam all night?

7) We had not been traveling for days before reaching our destination.

Que: Had we been traveling for days before reaching our destination?

8) John will not have been working as a teacher for five years.

Que: Will John have been working as a teacher for five years?

9) The children had not been playing outside for hours.

Que: Had the children been playing outside for hours?

10) They had not been waiting in line for the concert since early morning.

Que: Had they been waiting in line for the concert since early morning?
