

Exercise Key-Perfect Continuous Form of Tense

1) Will I have been working on this project for three hours?

Pos: I will have been working on this project for three hours.

Neg: I will not have been working on this project for three hours.

2) Has he been playing football since this morning?

Pos: He has been playing football since this morning.

Neg: He has not been playing football since this morning.

3) Had I been studying for the exam for hours?

Pos: I had been studying for the exam for hours.

Neg: I had not been studying for the exam for hours.

4) Had you been studying for the exam all night?

Pos: You had been studying for the exam all night.

Neg: You had not been studying for the exam all night.

5) Had the children been playing in the park all afternoon before it started to rain?

Pos: The children had been playing in the park all afternoon before it started to rain.

Neg: The children had not been playing in the park all afternoon before it started to rain.
