Que: Will you have been working on the project all day?

4) He will have been practicing the piano for a month.

Que: Will he have been practicing the piano for a month?

5) She will have been writing the book for several years.

Que: Will she have been writing the book for several years?

6) We will have been waiting for the bus for an hour.

Que: Will we have been waiting for the bus for an hour?

7) They will have been playing soccer since morning.

Que: Will they have been playing soccer since morning?

8) It will have been raining for days by the time we arrive.

Que: Will it have been raining for days by the time we arrive?

9) John will have been working as a teacher for five years.

Que: Will John have been working as a teacher for five years?

10) Sarah will have been studying abroad for six months.

Que: Will Sarah have been studying abroad for six months?
