

Exercise Key-Perfect Continuous Form of Tense

1) Has he been playing the piano for three hours?

Pos: He has been playing the piano for three hours.

Neg: He has not been playing the piano for three hours.

2) Have the children been playing in the park?

Pos: The children have been playing in the park.

Neg: The children have not been playing in the park.

3) Had I been working on this project for several hours?

Pos: I had been working on this project for several hours.

Neg: I had not been working on this project for several hours.

4) Will they have been playing soccer since morning?

Pos: They will have been playing soccer since morning.

Neg: They will not have been playing soccer since morning.

5) Have you been studying French all evening?

Pos: You have been studying French all evening.

Neg: You have not been studying French all evening.
