Write Interrogative Sentences (Key)

1) The construction workers will not have been building the bridge for a year.

Pos: *Will the construction workers have been building the bridge for a year?*

2) I will not have been working on this project for three hours.

Pos: *Will I have been working on this project for three hours?*

3) You will not have been studying French for six months.

Pos: *Will you have been studying French for six months?*

4) He will not have been playing the guitar for two hours.

Pos: *Will he have been playing the guitar for two hours?*

5) She will not have been traveling around Europe for a year.

Pos: *Will she have been traveling around Europe for a year?*

6) We will not have been waiting in line for hours.

Pos: *Will we have been waiting in line for hours?*

7) They will not have been rehearsing for the play for weeks.

Pos: *Will they have been rehearsing for the play for weeks?*

8) It will not have been raining all day.

Pos: *Will it have been raining all day?*

9) John will not have been studying for the exam all night.

Pos: *Will John have been studying for the exam all night?*

10) Sarah will not have been working on her novel for months.

Pos: *Will Sarah have been working on her novel for months?*
